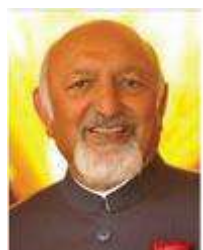

2. MISSION STATEMENT

The **Global Energy Parliament's (GEP)** mission is to provide recommendations and strategies, backed by scientific research, with the objective of ensuring a self-sustaining, peaceful existence for human beings and the universe.

3. EXPLANATION OF MISSION

Absolute happiness is essentially what all beings strive for. Momentary happiness is experienced naturally when one's system is at peace, which comes about when positive and negative energy are equilibrated.

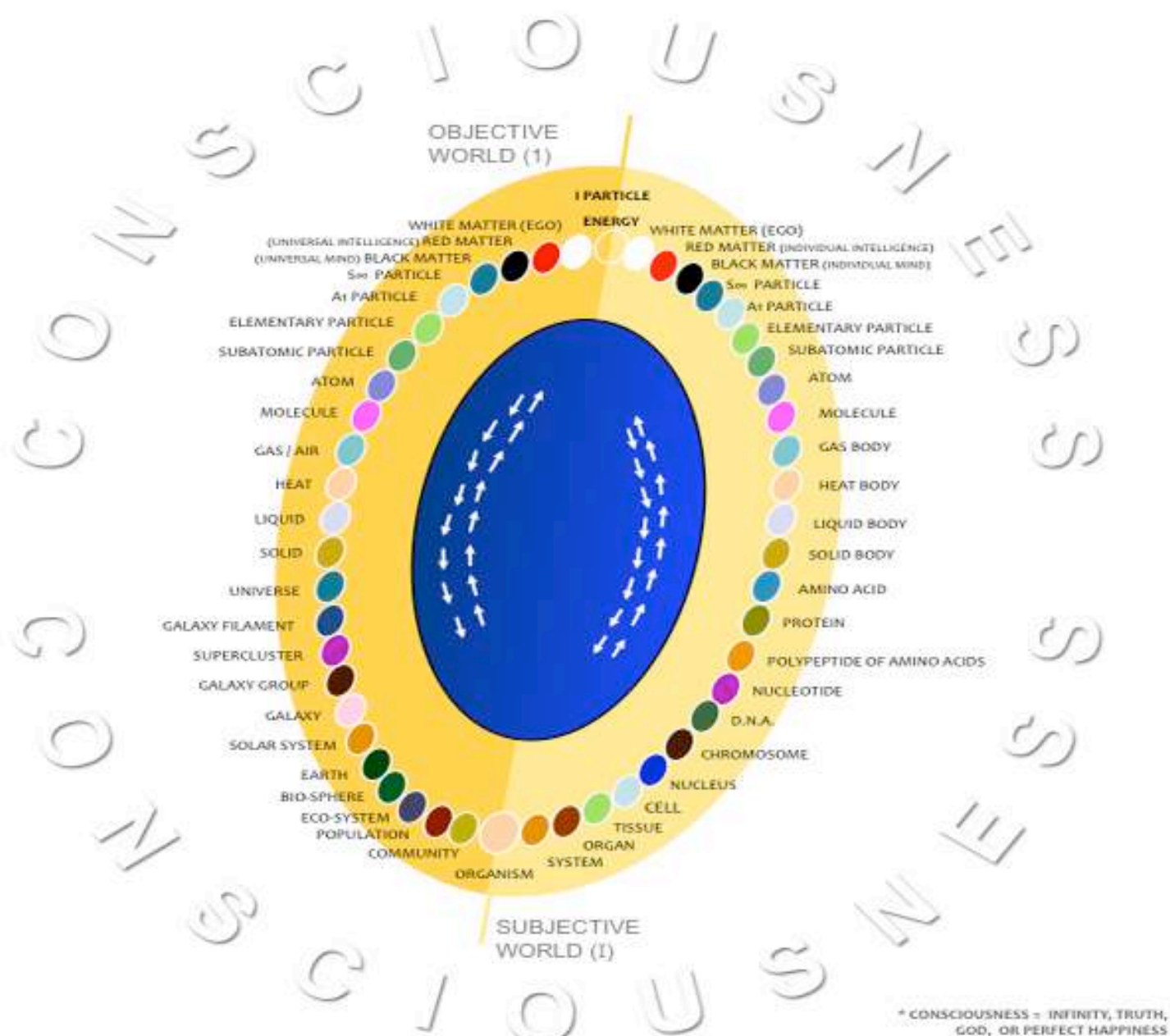
Therefore, our objective is to empower every individual, community, region and nation to arrive at self-sustaining/sustainable peace through energy equilibration. We offer a forum for each citizen to participate in building this reality, and we are developing the tools, technologies and means to enhance understanding Energy and Consciousness, and to equilibrate positive and negative energy—for peace, for sustainability, and for absolute happiness.



4. FOUNDATION 'I THEORY'

The foundation of the GEP is the **"I theory"**, a unified Theory of Everything developed by H.H. Swami Isa. The "I theory" explains that the entire Universe, including galaxies and atoms as well as thoughts and emotions, are nothing but vibration, or Energy. The objective world and the subjective world are linked by a fundamental, irreducible unit of vibration called the "I particle". The "I particle," with a positive and negative charge, creates three possible types of vibration as well as time and space. Thus, all matter and forms are made up from the different arrangements of these particles. Energy, or vibrating reality, arises from Consciousness, the non-vibrating reality.

5. HISTORY

The Global Energy Parliament was founded in 2000 by H.H. Swami Isa, starting with small meetings at schools, colleges, and organizations in Trivandrum, India. The first international meet was held in 2010, followed by annual sessions of Parliament in different countries thereafter:

In 2010, the GEP Award was instituted to recognize outstanding work on sustainability.

In 2012, the Global Energy Parliament Research Centre was founded to support the research of the Parliament.

In 2012, the GEP Delhi Chapter was inaugurated at the Rashtrapati Bhawan (residence of the Hon. President of India).

In 2015, the organizer of the Parliament, the Isa Viswa Prajnana Trust, was awarded consultative status to the United Nations’ Economic and Social Council (ECOSOC).

As of 2017, National Centres have been set up in India, Sri Lanka, Spain, France, Germany, United States, United Kingdom and Australia.



6. SESSIONS OF PARLIAMENT

GEP has a successful track record for developing interdisciplinary, science-based solutions to the major problems facing our nations. Sessions of Parliament bring together world leaders, scientists and scholars to discuss and develop solutions to important issues.

Parliamentary sessions are much like the Westminster system. Sessions include a Question Hour, Submission of Bills and Proposals, Call-Attention Motions, and Drafting and Voting on Resolutions.

Resolutions of Parliament are made available to all national governments and international organizations like the United Nations.

All participants are Members of Parliament, and some who have special expertise are appointed to be Ministers or in other leadership roles.

The GEP organizes Global Parliaments, National Parliaments, Students' Parliaments and Women's Parliaments.



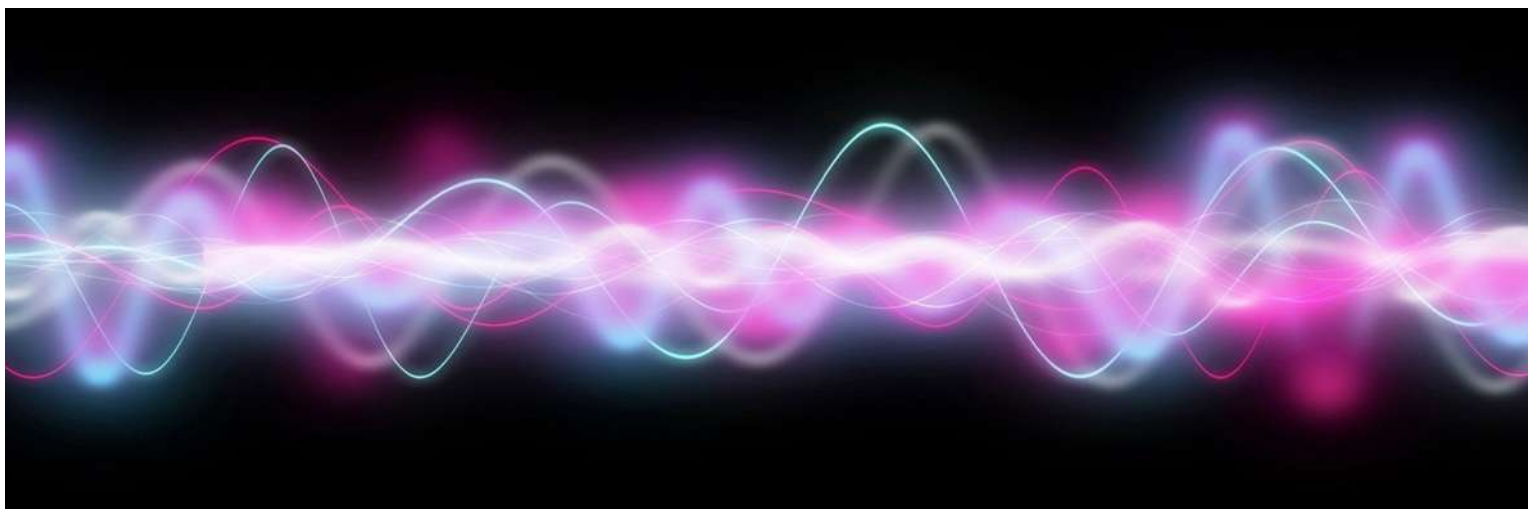
7. GEP RESEARCH CENTRE

The **GEP Research Centre (GEPRC)** is an international scientific study and research institution supporting the functions of Parliament. The conceptual basis of the GEPRC is the “**I Theory**”. Its objectives are to:

1. Investigate the energy imbalances leading to any and all issues that have been identified as areas of global concern by Parliament;
2. Provide long-term forecasts of the effects of identified energy imbalances;
3. Research and develop solutions (e.g., new methodologies, modalities and devices) that have a net positive impact;
4. Communicate evidence of the constructive and destructive energies inherent in all aspects of our society, from human thought to manufacturing processes.

Present areas of focus of the GEP Research Centre include:

- **Production of an Efficient Renewable Energy Source from Sound Energy (1) - Sound Energy Device**
In collaboration with CEA (France), GEP is developing a device to efficiently convert Sound Energy into electricity. The device uses sound and nanomaterials as semiconductors, to efficiently produce electricity. A 1 kW output power device is expected to be available to the public by the end of 2016.
- **Production of an Efficient Renewable Energy Source from Sound Energy (2) - Resonant Box**
- **A1 Particle Detector**
- **Pilot School Project to Measure the Efficacy of “Education for Total Consciousness”**
- **Study of the Practice of the Holistic Technique “Life for Total Consciousness” Developed by H.H. Swami Isa**
- **Assessing and Curing the Social Disease of Crime and Social Delinquency**



8. PROJECTS

9. STRUCTURE

The Global Energy Parliament is made up of National Energy Parliaments, which consist of Regional Energy Parliaments, which in turn consists of Local Energy Parliaments, in all parts of the globe.

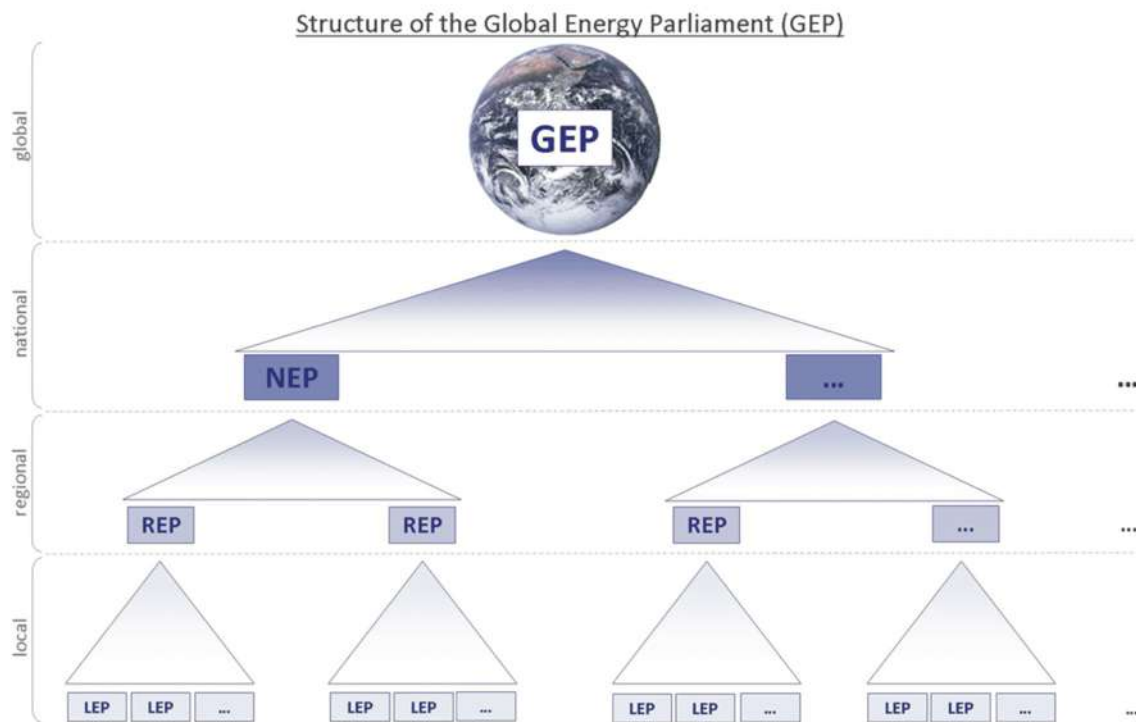


Fig.: Global to local hierarchy of the GEP. The GEP is made up of National Energy Parliaments which in turn consist of Regional and Local Parliaments.

Global Energy Parliament: Investigates international problems and decision-making at global level (ex: Solutions to the international economic crisis);

National Energy Parliaments: Investigates national problems (ex: German medical system), of which relevant recommendations and issues can be forwarded to GEP for discussion;

Regional Energy Parliaments: Concerned with state and regional issues (ex: the State of New York's decision on hydraulic fracturing) in a National Energy Parliament;

Local Energy Parliaments: Concerned with activities that affect communities, towns, villages and local bodies (ex: Neighbourhood tree-planting).

At each level, Parliaments provide policy leadership, funding, active research and recommendations submitted to elected governments, intra- and supra-national organisations.

10. FOUNDER



His Holiness Jagadguru Swami Isa is the Founder of the Global Energy Parliament, the charitable Isa Viswa Prajnana Trust, the Isa Viswa Vidyalayam School and the Isalayam Ashram in Thiruvananthapuram, Kerala, India.

Swamiji has developed an educational methodology, "Education for Total Consciousness," which is practiced in his education centres. ETC is a methodology which integrates outer and inner knowledge in a systematic way. In this way, ETC fulfils the noble aim of education: to bring the individual to the highest state of awareness of him or herself and the universe.

Swamiji's ultimate vision is to build a Universal University, envisioned as an ideal abode of learning in the ETC format. Its mission is to provide the right environment and tools for creating humane human beings living in harmony with their surroundings.

Equally passionate about informal as well as formal educational reform, Swamiji set up the Global Energy Parliament as a way to improve scientific literacy and research from the grassroots to the top level of society. Swamiji writes, "The individual and the world must be saved from the devastation caused by negative energy, and only a science that can understand and harmonize the realm of Energy can find a solution to this predicament. This is the need of the hour. A new generation must grow up with this awareness."

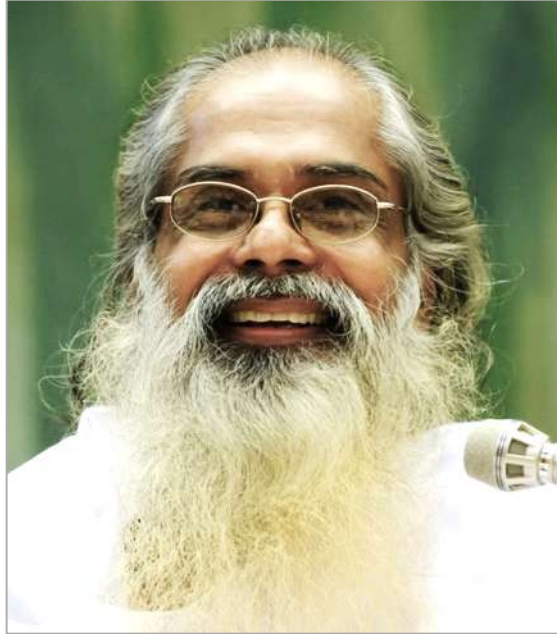
