



## **Global Energy Parliament Proposal for Better Waste Management**

The problem of waste management in the state of Kerala and the larger country has been well documented. Increasingly this problem has become a menace to society since the closure of waste treatment plants, due to political differences.

The Global Energy Parliament requests the Government of Kerala to take immediate action in stopping this problem and providing sustainable solutions to energy and building energy partnerships with other countries at the same time. We are proposing the same to the United Nations Commission on Sustainable Development.

1. Pass a municipal law making mandatory waste treatment at source for commercial establishments, using such methods as biogas and composting.
2. Sell the composted waste at a very low rate to countries, especially those in West Asia, who are in need of fertilizer.
3. Support the work of research institutes to develop a viable and affordable biogas plant for home-users with limited kitchen and outdoor space. Then, promote biogas to homeowners through rigorous awareness campaigns.

In nature, one organism's waste is another organism's food. Nothing is without use, we merely have to unlock its potential. We urge the government to think more creatively for the problem of waste treatment facing our society, in order to bring about efficient and productive societies.
