Education for Total Consciousness—Creating Education for All

The National Energy Parliament for India,

Reaffirming the NEP Education Committee’s commitment to solving the educational crisis at local, regional and national levels set forth in the discussions at the 1st National Energy Parliament for India in 2011,

Confirming the Govt of India Planning Commission’s 12th Plan goal to enable children including differently-abled children to “enjoy equal access to education” and to “strengthen the system at all levels” in India by 2017,

Emphasizing the importance of education to the growth and development of the nation especially in the scope of international economy,

Having studied the positive effects of a universal system of education that can be adopted in any school, curriculum, culture or country (viz. “Education for Total Consciousness”),

Convinced that “Education for Total Consciousness” will promote the development of every child to his or her full potential, regardless of her ability / disability, and thereby contribute to the nation as a whole,

Confident that the proposed system will promote the child’s full development [see Appendix 1],

Convinced that scientific-based assessment programmes of the child’s emotions, physical body, intellect, ego and ignorance on a daily basis contributes to greater teacher ability to mould humane human beings [See Appendix 2],

Reaffirming the low-cost benefits of its implementation in schools and universities [See Appendix 3],

Assured of the national community’s ability to accept the benefits and easily implement such a system,

1. Urges the Govt of India Human Resources Ministry to implement the Education for Total Consciousness scheme in all government schools in India;



2. Requests State Governments to establish ETC Teacher Training Centres to give adequate training to all teachers in the ETC methodology;
3. Encourages the Govt of India to utilize HRD funding to initiate such programmes as an investment on India's future ability to lead the world with a population of humane human beings;
4. Recommends that more research on the benefits of ETC be carried out to convince other Nations also in setting up similar schemes.

***Note: This submission is for a National Energy Parliament and so the sphere of concern is national level. For GEP resolutions the concern is worldwide.**
